



Diana Thorneycroft is a Winnipeg artist who has exhibited various bodies of work across Canada, the United States and Europe, as well as in Moscow, Tokyo and Sydney. She is the recipient of numerous awards including an Assistance to Visual Arts Long-term Grant from the Canada Council, several Senior Arts Grants from the Manitoba Arts Council and a Fleck Fellowship from the Banff Centre for the Arts.

Diana's series of photographic works *Group of Seven Awkward Moments* have been exhibited in solo shows across Canada including venues in Montreal, Winnipeg and Vancouver. *Canadian Art Magazine* selected the show as one of "The Top 10 Exhibitions of 2008".

This past May, the exhibition entitled "Diana Thorneycroft's Extraordinary Stories. Caustic Landscapes of Canadian *Imaginary*" was exhibited at the Canadian Cultural Centre in Paris.

Thorneycroft taught at the University of Manitoba's School of Art as a sessional instructor from 1984-2010. She lives in Winnipeg with her husband artist Michael Boss, and their 18 year old cat Larry.
