



Gillian McIntyre originally trained as a nurse at St. Bartholomew's Hospital, London England. She has a B.A. in Art and Art History ('94) and an M.A. in Museum Studies ('96) from the University of Toronto. Her Masters' thesis explored the relationship between the Art Gallery of Ontario (AGO) and so-called minority communities. McIntyre's responsibilities as Adult Program Coordinator at the AGO include the design and coordination of the AGO's adult public programs and interpretive planning. She is a founding member of the AGO's Diversity Advisory Group and has a particular interest in access initiatives. In 2010 McIntyre began a program, funded by The W. Garfield Weston Foundation, for people living with schizophrenia and other forms of mental illness. She is also currently partnering with the University Hospital Network in Toronto on a range of programs exploring the intersections between health and the arts.
