Jenny Secker

Jenny Secker is Professor of Mental Health at Anglia Ruskin University and the South Essex Partnership University NHS Foundation Trust. She trained in Edinburgh, first as a mental health nurse and later as a social worker. After completing her PhD with the Department of Social Work and Social Policy at Edinburgh University she worked as a researcher in a number of academic and practice organisations. Her main research interests are in the area of mental health, employment and social inclusion. Between 2005 and 2007 she led the team commissioned by the UK Department of Health and Department for Culture Media and Sport to carry out the study *Mental Health, Social Inclusion and Arts*. Following publication of that study she has supported the development and evaluation of Open Arts, a project providing arts participation and wider inclusive opportunities for people with mental health needs in South Essex.

Arts and mental health: what does the research tell us?

This keynote presentation will draw together evidence from research carried out in the UK into the benefits of arts participation for people with mental health needs. The evidence examined will include what has been learnt from studies of participatory arts initiatives with the wider population, but will focus in more detail on an England-wide study jointly commissioned by the Department of Health and Department for Culture, Media and Sport that aimed to develop the evidence base specifically in relation to the mental health and social inclusion of people with mental health needs. Results from the evaluation of a local participatory arts programme established in response to the positive results of the national study will then be presented along with some of the next steps needed to convince funders of the value of participatory arts in this field.
